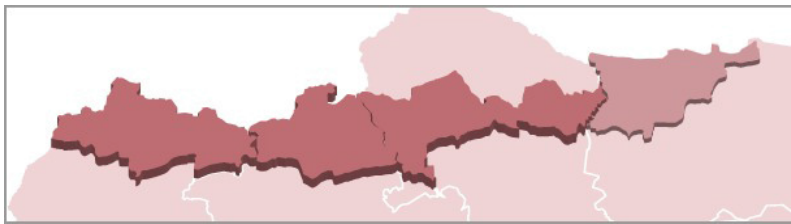


Osprey

SEASONAL BEHAVIOUR

Arrives in September (sometimes earlier) and leaves in March-April. Some birds linger on through much of the summer.

DISTRIBUTION

Scarce but regular on reservoirs throughout. Rare in Jaén, though regularly spotted at Yeguas Reservoir. In Córdoba normally confined to the reservoirs of Arenoso and Puente Nuevo. In Seville seen above all at José Torán, Melonares and El Pintado reservoirs. In Huelva it turns up at Zufre Reservoir and more commonly in Aracena Reservoir. Occasionally drops into other wetlands. The sites with the biggest number of wintering records are Aracena and José Torán reservoirs.

STATUS
