### STATUS

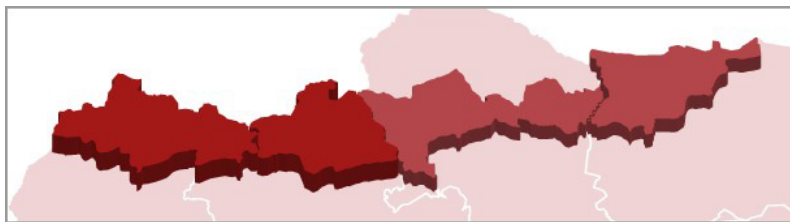
Winter visitor and resident breeder.

### ABUNDANCE

Abundant in winter, uncommon as breeder.

### HABITAT

In winter the Robin is a ubiquitous bird that turns up in scrub and woodland of all types, including gardens in built-up areas, as well as olive groves. Breeds in shady areas like riparian copses, north facing scrub, Sweet-Chestnut woods, Pyrenean-Oak woods or moist Cork-Oak woods with undergrowth.



### SEASONAL BEHAVIOUR

There are two populations, sedentary breeding birds and other birds that spend winter here. The former are here all year; the latter from September to March.

### DISTRIBUTION

Abundant throughout in winter. In summer more numerous in Huelva and Seville.
