### STATUS

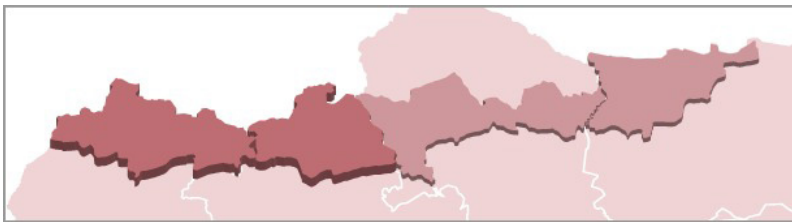
Summer visitor and migrant with some wintering birds.

### ABUNDANCE

Scarce in general: more frequent during passage.

### HABITAT

Breeds in broadleaved woods, mainly Sweet-Chestnut woods, Cork-Oak woods and riparian thickets, providing there are many ant-rich clearings (its favourite food). More flexible on migration, turning up even in the *campiña*. In winter sticks almost exclusively to livestock farming *dehesas*.



### SEASONAL BEHAVIOUR

Most are detected from March to September, although there are increasing records of wintering birds.

### DISTRIBUTION

As a breeder it is rare in the eastern half and more frequent in Huelva and Seville. Winter sightings in all four provinces.
